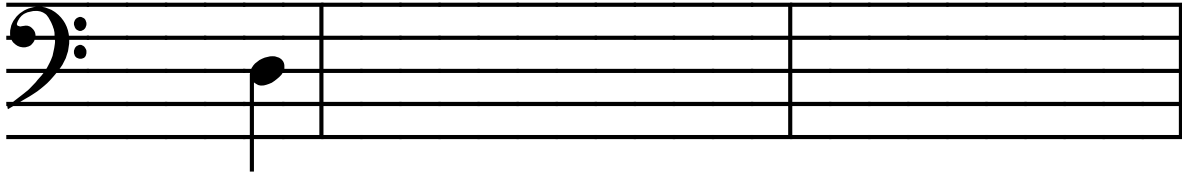
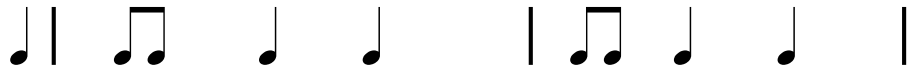
What note is the tonic in D Major? \_\_\_\_\_

- Play your composition on your instrument.

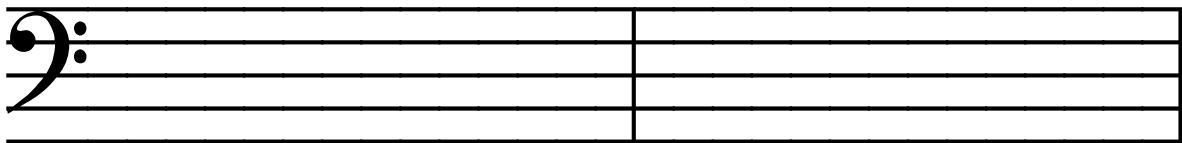

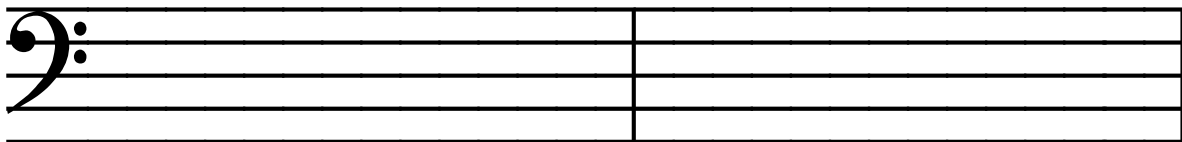

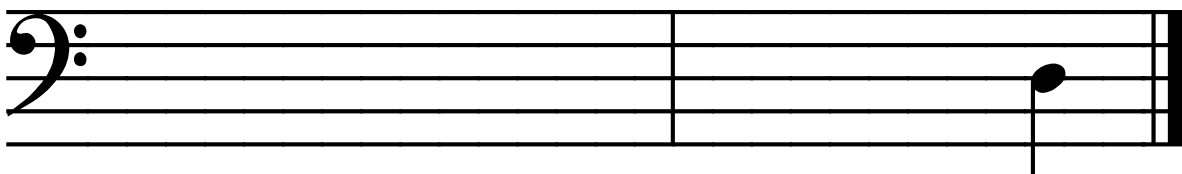
